Lease Violations

How should I notify CDC if my tenant is violating the terms of the lease? If your tenant is not complying with their lease agreement, and you have served them with a written notice of lease violation, be sure to provide a copy of that notice to CDC.

What if my tenant doesn't pay their portion of rent? After you issue a non-payment of rent notice to your tenant, please send a copy to CDC as well.

Why does CDC Need these Notices? Families receiving rental assistance through CDC are required to comply with their family obligations, including adhering to the terms of their lease. By submitting these notices to CDC, you help ensure CDC is able to take appropriate action if necessary.
